The legacy those brave troopers began in those early days continued to grow as others joined the fold. I am proud to be writing to our very special Band of Brothers, the 5th Battalion 7th Cavalry Association members, forty-plus years after its birth. Then we were training intensively, using nine-hour training days to master the prescribed basic and advanced unit training skills.

During our training we were physically tired and somewhat apprehensive because we knew where we were going. How could we have ever even dreamed then that we would become the first echelon of probably the most decorated infantry battalion in the Vietnam War?

How could any of us have imagined then that we would form an amazingly unique and vibrant association more than twenty five years later, our Association of the 5th Battalion, 7th Cavalry? How could we have imagined then that we would be together in August, 2006, to celebrate our eighth reunion? Unbelievable, right? But it's happening, troopers!

John Goosman, B-227 AHB --- John is a helicopter pilot that was shot down in Cambodia near LZ Snuffy June 30, 1970. This was John's E-Mail to Paul Giddens (Fast Flanker 1/4 & 4 Feb 68 – Feb 69): "Paul, maybe vou can help me out. Are you in touch with any of the 5/7 Cav people? We were shot down near LZ Snuffy somewhere inside Cambodia LZ Sphere or Black or Blackhorse. It was on 30 June 1970. It was a patrol from, I think, Echo Company or a recon unit that literally carried me out of the jungle and got me on a Huey - I think Major Fisher's bird from B Company, 227<sup>th</sup> AHB. I am looking for these soldiers who carried me out. It's like looking for a needle in a haystack. I owe these guys one great big steak dinner. Thanks. Goose"

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing to you because of a letter the U.S. Consulate in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, has received regarding a letter from Nguyen Hung Son

writing on behalf of his father, Nguyen Thi Ngoc.

Nguyen Thi Ngoc's son and daughter and his

nephew did not return home

one day in May of 1969. The children had been seen running after

soldiers on the side of Phy Giao forest asking for candies or canned

food. They did not return that day and the family searched for them for

more than three months. They thought they had died.

In January, 2006, Nguyen Thi Ngoc met Mr. Dan Hoc Gia in Phuoc Hoa village, Phu Giao district, Binh Duong province. Mr. Gia said that he

was the interpreter for an operation named: "Head Quarter. 1st Air

Cavalry Division, APO SF, 96490, commanded by 3rd BDE General Robert M.

Shoemaker and General Robert M. Tarbox, Assistant."

Mr. Nguyen said that this unit had been in the Phu Giao zone from November 1968 until February 1972. Mr. Gia also said that on the day in

question, he saw "...three children who were lost in Phu Giao forest

zone include two boys and a girl. The girl died. Two boys after that had been transferred to the hospital of American

had been transferred to the hospital of American."

Do you have any idea how we might follow up on this? Perhaps someone from this unit remembers some children. Perhaps someone remembers

taking them to a hospital. Or, maybe someone else has another explanation.

Thank you for any help you can provide.

Dear Mr. Patrick:

I was privileged to serve as the interim battalion surgeon for 5/7 CAV in Iraq from August-September 2005, relieving CPT Jitu Modi, MD, the outstanding permanent battalion surgeon. I'm tired of urban myths and media bias in the coverage of events in Iraq. I served for OIF-III from early May 2005 through mid-January 2006. Major media outlets barely mention the tremendous humanitarian efforts of folks serving there.

SPC Russell H. Nahvi joined the Army as a medic from Arlington,

Texas. He was assigned to 5th Battalion of the 7th Cavalry Regiment during Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF)-III at Forward Operating Base (FOB) Paliwoda near Balad, Iraq. Volunteering for yet another patrol, Russell was killed immediately by a roadside bomb (improvised explosive device, or IED) on the evening of October 19, 2005, during a patrol near Balad. Russell was the son of Sam and Nancy Nahvi, who works as a nurse. Russell was 24 years old and an American Soldier who selflessly served others at every opportunity, including the ultimate sacrifice.

The SPC Russell H. Nahvi Memorial Fund for Pediatric Research has been established at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. The Nahvi Fund will not support faculty salaries, travel, administrative, fundraising, or publication costs. It will support only the direct costs of pediatric research for projects deemed worthy by the UTHSCSA Director of Pediatric Research, Dr. Chuck Leach. Dear Ms. Conti,

Your father served in the 5th Battalion 7th Cavalry Regiment which was a part of the 1st Cavalry Division. Our association records indicate he served in D Company from April 1966 to July 1967. This means he trained with the Battalion when it was formed in Ft. Carson, Colorado in the summer of 1966. The men who were part of the battalion when it formed at Fort Carson in 1966 all went to Vietnam as a 750 man strong unit. We shipped over on the USS Gaffey and arrived 17 days later at Quihnon, Vietnam. The base camp for the 1st Cavalry division was in Ankhe, Vietnam about 40 miles inland from our port of entry.

The 5th Battalion 7th Cavalry completed its service in Vietnam in 1971 as one of the most decorated units of the Vietnam War.


