How to Obtain Your Army Records and Locate Our Fellow Troopers

I received a package from the *National Personnel Record Center* today. They mailed it to me by mistake. (But that's another story.) Sometime ago James Mitchell asked me to look into getting his medals and some other information.

We got the other information right away, but eight months later I got his medals in the mail. It only took two days from the time it was mailed so it wasn't the Post Offices fault. I think the SF 180 form wasn't clear on where to mail the medals to because of other things we asked for.

I opened up the package because I wanted to see them. They sure look pretty. So new and clean a tear came to my eye when I saw them. It also brought back a few memories.

So if you want your medals all you have to do is write for them. It may take eight months but you will get them. They are free too. You already paid the price for them. So write for them!

To write for your medals write to:

National Personnel Record Center 9700 Page Blvd. St. Louis MO 63132-5100

Or contact me and I will help. Remember in will take around eight months, so do it now. My address is **922 Cleta Dr., Ballwin, MO 63021**.

While you are writing for your medals ask for a copy of your orders while you were with the 5/7 Cav. We need the names to find our fellow troopers. We can't find the people if we don't know who they are.

If you need help finding someone, all you have to do is ask. I will help you find them, or point you in the right direction. I'll give you some names and phone numbers for you to call. All the person will say is "No, I am not the one you are looking for", or "God I'm so glad you called. How have you been?"

You will be surprised how many 5/7 Cav vets are eager to talk to someone who was in their unit.

For me the comradeship was a spiritual uplifting. For Kathy, it was like a child experiencing her first day at a circus, all the sights, sounds, and merriment.

I am again honored that you elected me as Veteran Advisor. For those who know me I do not take this task lightly. In years past others have helped me through the rough times, so how could I do less. It's a "Brother" thing.

In this article I will cover two (2) major agenda's and very important for all of us.

1. Veterans Vote!!

It is your way to make a powerful statement. True, we should not overlook the Presidential Campaign, yet our real power as people are the votes we cast for our senators and representatives. Too often they represent special interest groups who do little for the common good or they look the other way instead of heeding the real needs of the people. Look at the Flag Amendment. The House of Representatives voted for it twice, the Senators stopped it. Even Senators who own people at home demanded approval.

For this election carefully review the candidates. Check out their track records as to Veterans Benefits; how they voted on helping Homeless Veterans; and how they reacted to Social Security and Medicare. All one can ask is for you to vote your conscious and rid all of us of the "Good Ole Boys"!

2. Your Health!

When someone receives the sentence from the physician "You have cancer" the words are like a deathblow. No one can tell another the fears, anxiety, and hopelessness the individual feels.

Mine came in 1976, when I was still in the Army. I lost a kidney, urethra, and half a bladder. My career in the Army was finished. People labeled me or treated me like I was contagious and for ten years I was experimented with by the Army and later the VA.

Only after I was retired did they link my conditions to Agent Orange. Yes, I am on the registry and followed closely by the VA. I have not had prostrate cancer but I have been warned repeatedly that I have a strong chance of acquiring it.

A few years ago an unsung hero named Patrick Dockery requested information from all of us as to our medical ills since Vietnam. Sadly few really came forward and admitted they or their family had acquired problems. Maybe some felt it was an invasion of their privacy, or felt ashamed, or did not see the real sense of it.

In our Veterans Benefit meeting at Nashville one of my own medics announced he had been operated on for prostrate cancer and pleaded with others to get a check up and let the VA know about it. What a hero!! What guts that took!

None of us want to be a statistic. In a way it is degrading. Yet, we can help our future families, our Brothers, and ourselves.

Any, and I mean any, information passed to me or to Pat Dockery is confidential. Please contact Pat or me if you need help. I've listed our addresses at the end of this article.

In future articles I will repeat the steps to achieve your VA Benefits and the appeals process and use of the Advocates Programs for legal representation.

Only by helping you all NOW, can I repay those in my past who gave me the greatest gift: The Spirit to Live.

Recap of Reunion V Events By Ted Swett

The reunion began on July 2 and ended on July 9. The first three days were devoted to tourist activities, with the formal portion commencing Wednesday evening with an icebreaker and free pizza.

We had business meetings on Thursday and Friday mornings, with nominations for the new slate of Board members, Company Trustees and Executive Committee officers on Thursday and the elections on Friday. On Thursday we also had presentations by representatives from the Dept of Veterans Affairs and the Disabled American Veterans, followed by Q's and A's. We arranged this in order to provide assistance with claims, and for PTSD cases in particular. Our high watermark in attendance was Friday, when we had 380 troopers and quests.

There were three highlights during the reunion. First, the only living one of our four Medal of Honor awardees, Mike Sprayberry, D5/7 (1968) joined us Thursday evening. This was his first of the five reunions we have now had, and his presence inspired us all. He is a modest, soft-spoken and affable guy who seemed almost embarrassed at our spontaneous demonstration of admiration and respect for him. What a trooper!

Another very special highlight was having General (Ret.) Barry McCaffrey, C2/7(1968) as our keynote speaker at the Friday business meeting. He had originally been scheduled to be our banquet speaker that evening, but a conflict with an official responsibility he had to meet forced him to change his travel schedule. He went out of his way to be with us, and gave an inspirational talk which got to us all. What a trooper!

(A bit of serendipity resulted when Barry, in chatting with some of our troopers, realized that a couple of them had been under his command in Germany, including our MH trooper, Mike Sprayberry.)

Our final highlight was our traditional Memorial Service. We held it on Saturday moming at the Nashville War Memorial. During the service the names of each of our 286 fallen comrades were read. A representative from each company read the name of each KIA from his company. Our Chaplain, the Reverend Eddie Rape, B5/7(1969) gave the opening and closing prayers.


During the reading of the names a gaggle of choppers just happened to fly over the War Memorial...and tears flowed.

I passed the baton to the new 5/7 Cav Association officers: John Long, C 5/7(1966) President; Karl Haartz, C 5/7(1966) 1st Vice President; Ed Perry, E 5/7(1969) 2d Vice President; Allen Patrick, B 5/7(1966) Communications; Jerry Houston, Hq 5/7(1966) Battalion Secretary; Jasper Catanzaro, B 5/7(1966) Financial Secretary.

At each reunion we present Man-of-the-Year Awards for the two years since the previous reunion, and the President's Award to the trooper who has made the biggest difference for the Association since the preceding reunion. (Earlier winners are not eligible.) The winners were Ed Perry for 1999 and Allen Patrick for 2000. The President's Award went to Jerry Houston, who not only almost single-handedly staged the Nashville reunion - the best one yet - but who has kept our books flawlessly since taking over as Financial Secretary four years ago. He will continue to serve us as the new Battalion Secretary.

Having been the Association's President since its organization in 1992, I decided to step down and let the youngsters take over, and was honored to be elected President Emeritus. I was given an elegant First Team watch to mark the occasion. Wes Westmoreland, my close friend and 1st Vice President since 1992, also decided to "retire." Wes, C 5/7, who was the youngest First Sergeant in the Army when the battalion was organized in 1966, retired as a Division CSM. He was consistently the hardest working of all the 5/7 Cav troopers, and the growth of the Association is the result of his leadership. (We have over 3,000 good addresses of 5/7 Cav veterans, with more showing up each month.) He won the President's Award at our Washington D.C. Area reunion in 1998, and is now Vice President Emeritus What a trooper!


