The unit as a whole was also awarded the Valorous Unit Citation. Missing from this reunion because of previous commitments was one of the Platoon Leaders, Captain Mike Sprayberry, whose individual heroic actions earned him the very special distinction of being awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for his personal bravery.

Over several days the participants shared memories of events from so long ago, exchanged photographs, viewed films, attended group activities along the waterfront hosted by Shawnee Boat Club & James Saddler, and were guests of honor at the invitation of local fraternal organizations. A flagpole was erected on the lawn in front of the Spencer home to commemorate this event. While the former soldiers interacted on their own level, their wives enjoyed getting to know each other, and formed their own bonds of friendship.

The consensus is not only that this reunion was long overdue (43 years!), but that this should be a start for continuing to stay in touch and meet more often. Everyone was also reminded that the Battalion Reunion of the 5/7 Cavalry is scheduled for late July, 2012 in San Antonio, Texas and were encouraged to participate.
