Sir - I'm LTC Jody Petery, currently assigned at Hohenfels Germany as the S3 of the Combat Maneuver Training Center. On 5 May 04 I'll be taking command of 1-3 ADA BN at Fort Stewart GA, and will transition this BN into an Armored Recon Squadron, to be designated 5-7 Cav. I believe the lineage will be traced directly to 5-7 Cav (Airmobile). The Armored Recon Squadron will be the "eyes and ears" of the 1st BDE, 3 ID as the entire Division leads the Army into transforming into Units of Action and Units of Employment. I said, "What happened now?" He said, "I just got hit." I could not believe it because it would have had to hit me too. I figured it was another snake story. Sure enough, he took a few more steps and then decided to pull down his pants. He had a very small hole in the left cheek of his butt and it drew about two drops of blood. We both got a laugh out of that.

Another time we spent about 4 hours in a foxhole watching the Air Force blow the hell out of a village just 100 meters in front of us. Those bombs were so close

we thought they were going to hit us. In fact, one F4 flew so close overhead we could see the pilot as he let loose with a 500-pounder.

Charlie loved to dance and sing. I was from Detroit and Charlie loved the music from Motown. I think he knew all the hits coming from Motown. I will always remember him singing "My Girl" the first time we got to the EM Club in Colorado. Charlie made many of us laugh. We didn't laugh at him. We laughed with him. For those of you who have copies of Bernie Grady's book, "On the Tiger's Back" you see a chapter about Charlie Love. It truly is a shame the short memories we have of people and the how fast the many years since that time have gone This is why this Association is around. Take the time and talk to those who made you laugh and were with you during best of times and the worse of times.
