PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Fellow Troopers,

Ever wonder "why me" and not someone else who died in Vietnam? I sure have, and I imagine many others have too. It is part of a normal response to our combat experience. After many years to reflect and a lifetime of reading and studying war and its impact on soldiers like us, I am convinced that such thoughts can either cause us to allow guilt to plunge us into despair, or we can recognize and be grateful for the incredible gift of life, now long and full for old warriors such as we. So much of what happens in battle truly is random. So how might we choose to use the gift of life in our remaining years?

I submit that, first; we must never forget those who did not come home with us. It can truly be said that there, but for the grace of God, would I lie with my name etched in black granite or white marble. Let us therefore take upon ourselves the solemn duty of continuing to remember our fallen brothers and honoring their memory, not just when we gather for our reunions, but as often as we stop to think about our war and what will always be our duty until we too cross over to Fiddlers Green to join our brothers lost in their youth. Second, let us resolve to live as well as we can every day no matter what comes along. Life is to be lived as fully as possible with those we love and to whom we are bound by the brotherhood of battle. This year has been especially challenging for all of us who are in the high risk group for the novel coronavirus. That has meant sacrifices we haven't wanted to make in terms of being unable to travel and be with our loved ones and our buddies from long ago. It has interrupted our brotherhood as members of this wonderful association of the 5/7 Cavalry. We have had to cancel gathering at the Memorial Wall on Memorial Day and our biennial reunion in Hot Springs. Please plan to be present when we meet there next year! Even our November reunion this coming Veterans Day is uncertain for the moment. So let us find other ways to stay connected until we can be together again in person to celebrate our shared sacrifices and the fact that we answered the call to duty when our country called.

No one can do more for this great country that was born when the Declaration of Independence proclaimed something never before attempted in world history. We were to be a nation of free people based on the consent of the governed, not the might of the conqueror or the divine right of kings to rule over others. We claimed certain inalienable rights granted not by man, but by God. I am slowly restocking the pins in the PX. As we are not having the reunion, I did not make a huge order of items. We did add some 5th Squadron related pins to the inventory.

Hello All,

Just a quick catch up, trust you are all well in your various bunkers. Some of you know that I'm still hunkered down in the Catskills (150 miles from NYC) and things are going well. Managed to get a haircut the other day at the local salon, kind of looks like my old Army buzz cut.

You may already know about this but wasn't going to assume that you did, so if this is duplication of effort then hit the delete button.

If you and/or spouse/significant other are taking retirement money out of an IRA or 401(k) or 403 (b) you should know about this.

When you get to a certain age (most of you are already passed it like me) the IRS rules say that you have to take out a Required Minimum Distribution – RMD. I just learned from one of the money managers where I have funds that in all the legislation passed in the spring, they allowed the waiving of the RMD for 2020. Unless I missed it somewhere, I haven't seen or heard any talk about this in the news or the other usual places that might carry it.

I did check with my accountant and he said yes this was a real thing and passed on to me an article from US News that gives a more detailed explanation –

SUBJECT: Update on the Warpaint Squadron

26 May 2020

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I sincerely hope this finds the friends and alumni of the Squadron well, and healthy in these strange times we find ourselves.

The Squadron is as busy as ever! We returned from the National Training Center (NTC), Rotation 20-04 in March. This was our certifying event that places the 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, of which we are a part, at the highest state of readiness for any ABCT across the Army formation. The Squadron performed superbly, and was lauded by the FORSCOM CG, General Garrett, and the Commander of Operations Group, COL Simmering, as the most aggressive Cavalry Squadron that they had seen in almost two years-worth of rotations. Unique to this rotation, the Squadron had the opportunity to work with the Royal Dragoons from the United Kingdom, as they sent a Troop's worth of scouts to augment the Squadron, and assisted in the Cavalry's success.

Subsequent to NTC, we have found ourselves navigating this concept of "Minimal Readiness Manning" as a result of the government's COVID-19 response. Admittedly, for the Squadron, this has changed precious little in terms of who shows up day-to-day – it's impossible to tele-work on Abrams and Bradleys! In April, the Squadron ran the Quarantine and Isolation Facility for the Division – caring for those individuals who had either suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-19. While certainly not glamorous, this was critical to support the Division and the Fort Stewart Installation as a whole as a means of containing those who were sick, or were suspected of being sick.

Simultaneously, we have focused the Squadron's efforts on maintenance, Annual Services on our equipment, and preparing for gunnery. We roll out to conduct crew qualifications on the 8th of June, but even this poses interesting challenges as the Squadron conducts simulation training and prepares to roll out while maintaining the same social-distancing norms. Medics with thermometers routinely screening personnel, masks, and double-arm intervals have become part of this organization's daily routine, and will continue to be so for the foreseeable future. At least until the pandemic is behind us.

Even though operations aren't "as normal," the Squadron still took the time to honor those that came before. On Memorial Day, 25MAY, the Officers, NCOs, and Soldiers conducted a memorial workout, and then spent the day fixing the signs on Warrior's Walk for all the fallen. For those not familiar, Warrior's Walk is a memorial, where a tree is planted for each Soldier that has been killed in battle in 3ID during the Global War on Terror. The Squadron has 17 trees planted there for its 17 personnel – it was a terrific opportunity to honor our fallen Troopers and reflect on their sacrifice.
