A SOLDIER GONE HOME Today (1/2/09) John Taylor, Hawk, Joe and I (Vince Laurich) attended the funeral service for our friend and PLT SGT in A 5/7 1968. Along with us, the other folks in attendance were celebrating the life of Command Sergeant Major (ret) Lorenzo Clark. It was an incredible event. The Mt Olive Baptist Church in Arlington, VA, a large church, was almost full with family, friends, and members of the church community.

The two hour service was beautiful, lively and loud. It was obvious to all that it was indeed a celebration and the Holy Spirit was among us. Hymns, songs, choir, pianos, organs, scripture and prayer preceded eight individuals giving reflections and testimony.

We learned that Lorenzo not only achieved the highest enlisted rank in the Army but he also was a super active leader in his church and community. More than one witnessed and quite a few defined Lorenzo as their mentor, role model, and Soldier's Soldier.

Pastor James Victor Jr. delivered an energized and inspirational eulogy. I could not begin to adequately repeat it. Simply put --- the road to salvation is hard unless we prepare ourselves. Lorenzo was prepared.

The Celebration continued with a caravan of cars to Arlington National Cemetery. Some unwanted excitement occurred as we tried to stay together and follow cars on I395 N and the nearby busy highways. We got there eventually and gathered as the Honor Guard transferred the casket from the hearse into the horse drawn caisson.

I've never attended a military funeral but they didn't hold anything back for one of their own: band, bugle, color guard, rifle team, etc. It was an honor for us to be present.

We returned to the cars and followed in procession to the burial site. The Army Chaplain and the Pastor did more readings and blessings, the flag and Honor Guard, etc.

Another Interesting tidbit --- the Chaplain at the gravesite mentioned Lorenzo's service with the Honor guard in the 70's as a 1st SGT and later as CMS of the Old Guard, his commitment to excellence, service, and his standing among his military peers. And he drew focus that Lorenzo once stood and honored others as these young men now stood for him. Now he's resting in a great place.

The cemetery still had the Christmas wreaths in certain sections.


A few passages taken from a message from Lorenzo Clark and shared with all today:

- Greetings to my Family and Friends--- A few days ago I sat and stood as you are today. Due to an illness beyond my control I could no longer stay here with you. I will miss hearing and seeing old and familiar faces but as we know our GOD doesn't make any mistakes. When he comes he only takes what belongs to him so he came for me. Oh Yea I was ready. I had completed the course. I ran my race to the end.
- You see my Family today. I am so proud of them sitting there knowing where I
 have gone and who I am with. Be strong in God's grace and He will be merciful
 unto you.

Did I say it was incredible! Beautiful!! It certainly was a grand celebration of life for a Soldier's Soldier and a man. Keep the peace. More later, Vince Laurich

5th Squadron 7th Cavalry Report By LTC Kirk Dorr



The "Warpaint" Squadron wishes all of you a belated "Happy New Year" from Fort Stewart, Georgia. The Squadron has emerged from the holiday and inaugural season, and is currently engaged in a lengthy field training exercise that will encompass qualifying all of our Cavalry Fighting Vehicles, HMMWV ("Humvee") gun trucks, and Mortar crews for the first time in almost two years.

We continue to build the new team for what is expected to be a future deployment (early 2010) to Iraq or Afghanistan. Unfortunately, we have recently farewelled many great Troopers who have transitioned to other assignments, but our new team is particularly talented and motivated for future missions.

In conjunction with training our core competencies and honing our warfighting skills, the Squadron continues to support the 1st Brigade Combat Team's Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and high-yield Explosive Consequence Management Response Force (CCMRF).

Since 1 OCT 08, and for the first time in its existence, U.S. Northern Command has a dedicated force to respond to potential chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear and high-yield explosive (CBRNE) incidents in the homeland. The CBRNE Consequence Management Response Force, or CCMRF, is a team of about 4,700 joint personnel that would deploy as the Department of Defense's initial response force for a CBRNE incident. Its capabilities include search and rescue, decontamination, medical, aviation, communications and logistical support.

The Squadron must be prepared to deploy within 48 hours to any location in the United States to support this unique task force.

On 7 February at Fort Stewart, the Squadron will host a Cavalry Ball. Our guest speaker is Lieutenant General (Ret) Harold G. Moore, the honorary Colonel of the 7th Cavalry Regiment and the esteemed co-author of "We Were Soldiers Once...and Young", and "We Are Soldiers Still".

Major General (Ret) and Mrs. Edmonds are also attending. This will be the first time in several years that we have had the opportunity to conduct such an event. For the next article, I'll be sure to include some pictures and a summary of this special occasion.

Finally, I would like to send a special thanks to those Alumni Association members who made donations to the Squadron Family Readiness Group this holiday season. These gifts go a long way towards improving the Soldier quality of life and Family-oriented programs we try so very hard to resource.

The Association has always been there for us, providing encouragement, financial and moral support, and more. Your willingness to dedicate your time and resources to show our Troopers that they are not forgotten, and that people appreciate their service, means more to these Soldiers than you can ever imagine. I can't say thanks enough. God Bless and GARRYOWEN!
