5/7 Squadron Update

Warpaint Friends and Family,

The Squadron continues to set conditions for a seamless transition of Squadron leaders and maintain momentum in our transition from New Equipment Training crew gunnery to collective training focus.

As we continue to train lethal teams using the Army's most modernized equipment; Apache, Blackfoot, and Darkhorse Troops completed their NET Crew Gunnery and transitioned into AOM and SRP operations in preparation for IRP while Comanche Troop and our Fire Support Teams continued BFV OPNET 3. Additionally, Horseman, Apache, Blackfoot, Darkhorse, and Diesel Troops conducted Javelin Fielding / OPNET, CSS Scout-VSAT OPNET, and AMPV OPNET 4 C4I/MFCS validation.

Our people and the Team continue to be our most valued resource and we continue to look for ways to invest back. The Squadron completed Spring Clean Up to ensure we maintain a high standard within the DIV and BDE footprints, conducted a leader symposium at The Citadel in Charleston, SC to help grow the Army, conducted a Squadron Ball at the Marriott Savannah Riverfront in downtown Savannah where we hosted CSM(R) Troxell, conducted H2F morning PT with the Striveworks and G3/5/7 Team, and competed in the BDE Best Squad Competition.

Over the next two weeks the Squadron will continue Gunnery, begin transition within Squadron Leadership, continue Maintenance and Personnel preparation, and ensure we capture the lessons learned from our GREAT Inspection to build sustainable systems and processes.

Training Highlights: The Squadron conducted M2 OPNET 3, Javelin OPNET, CSS-SCOUT-VSAT OPNET, AMPV C4I/MFCS Validation, an H2F competition supervised by Striveworks, a Team Leader Academy, BDE Best Squad, MFLC Wellness Checks, Rolling Readiness – SRP, the GREAT Inspection, a Leader Symposium at the Citadel, hosted an LPD provide by CSM John W. Troxell, a Squadron Ball, and completed two funeral details.

Apache Troop, led by CPT Greg Walker and 1SG Morgan Wallace, executed the GREAT Inspection on 26APR23. The troop provided 4x BFVs for the inspection with a 100% pass rate. Additionally, the Troop competed in BDE Best Squad Competition and executed a workout with the H2F team. (#7

Blackfoot Troop, led by CPT Denny Song and 1SG David Cordero, conducted After Operations Maintenance (AOM). The troop focused on vehicle, weapon, and equipment maintenance, OCIE layouts, and administrative tasks. 

The Troop qualified 11 crews with 6 crews qualifying superior and 1 qualifying distinguish with a top score of 921. The troop average was 836. Darkhorse then shifted focus to personnel and supply readiness with a fifteen day after operations maintenance process, culminating in the completion of medical and personnel

Diesel Troop, led by CPT Josh Anderson and 1SG Justin O'Donnell, took COL Wilson on a maintenance terrain walk through the Squadron motor pool, highlighting procedures our maintenance team uses. It also conducted the GREAT inspection and completed SRP in preparation for the IRP mission. Last, the Troop conducted ASU inspections prior to the SQDN ball and completed AOM for recently fielded equipment. (#11)
