We expect that our first group of redeploying Soldiers will return to Georgia in less than a week! Excitement continues to build on this side of the Atlantic and I know that all of you understandably share the same anticipation. Following arrival and a 24-hour pass, Soldiers will conduct a five-day reintegration program to ensure that everyone is taken care of. Specifically, your Soldiers will go through several briefs reorienting them to Fort Stewart and the local area, post-deployment medical screening, and finance. Once complete with their five-day reintegration, all Soldiers will have the opportunity to take two full weeks of leave – the best part !

Patience, understanding, and open communication will be key as your Soldiers return to their lives back home. Our Home Station Mission Command (ie: Rear-Detachment) stands ready to assist and Fort Stewart even has several programs that can help with reintegration. We're ending our time in the Baltics with a bang! There couldn't have been a better way to end our deployment than with a Darkhorse gunnery and Spur Ride. Our Warfighters have done an amazing job maintaining momentum from start to finish.

As soon as they entered Lithuania, Darkhorse Troop has held a strong presence and exemplified the Squadron's lethality. The thunderous sound of Abrams sending rounds down range echoed for miles while the Troop conducted its Gunnery. The VIP crew consisting of CSM Padilla, 1SG Riley, SFC Hoover, and SSG Rickard was an impressive site to see. PV2 Dakota Brown 1-41 FA Fire Support Specialist



OPERATIONAL SECURITY

The time for our return home has arrived! As your Soldier gets assigned a flight it is important to be mindful of Operational Security for the protection of the Squadron and its family members:

- Publishing information relating to <u>flight times</u> or sharing it with outside organizations is PROHIBITED.
- Families will be contacted directly by their Service Member in regards to they day they are slated to fly out.

WELCOME HOME CEREMONY

A Welcome Home Ceremony will be provided to Soldiers as the return to Ft. Stewart. Families and Friends are encouraged to attend and cheer on their Soldier as they enter the parade field. A brief welcome speech will be provided and Soldiers will be immediately released back to their Families.

- Welcome Home Ceremony times will be provided via the Squadron Facebook page and email about 11 hours prior to the ceremony.
- <u>Primary location</u> for the ceremony will be Cottrell Field. In the case of inclement weather, the ceremony will be moved to its <u>alternate location</u> at Newman Gym.
- Those wishing to attend the ceremony who don't have a DoD ID must have a Real-ID or two forms of identification (birth certificate, drivers license, social security card)


WELCOMING BACK YOUR SOLDIER

REINTEGRATION

To maximize the amount of time our Soldiers spend with their Families, the following reintegration plan will take place:

- Following the Welcome Home Ceremony Soldiers will immediately get 24 hours of leave. Soldiers will report on the next weekday if there leave falls into the weekend.
- After leave, Soldiers will begin a 5 day reintegration plan including various briefs and appointments. This will only be held MON-FRI.
- Soldiers will be offered 14 days of opportunity leave after completion of Day 5 of reintegration.


